Mission Statement: To teach Environmental Literacy; to cherish, protect and conserve the living earth.

School Description: The Living Earth Environmental School is composed of a minimum of 40 hours of study divided into four courses of ten hours each, which includes a two-hour field trip. The courses investigate AIR, LAND and WATER. The units are divided into Ecology and Environmental Science, Life on Earth, and Earth Stewardship. The courses teach participants environmental literacy, appreciation of the natural world, encourage action for sustainable development and appreciation of the interrelationship of all living things. Particular emphasis is presently placed on land conservation, water conservation and air quality.

Optional open book exams are offered for those wishing to become NGC Accredited Environmental Consultants. **These four courses must be completed within seven years. Exams are optional, however; if you wish to be an accredited Environmental Consultant, you must take the exams. After passing two courses, a student may become a Provisional Consultant and join an Environmental Consultants Council*. To remain in Good Standing, every five years Environmental Consultants must attend ES Refresher or an ES Course, no exam required**
